Adopted December 13, 2008

(Tom) As I sit here writing you this, at 5:30 in the morning, Nora is play chasing Brodie around their new home...

Once settled into our home, Nora chose to relocate her and Brodie's main living area to the other side of the bedroom. Opposite to where we had our beautifully constructed pen set up! Nora set up camp under the nightstand and Brodie in the box or under the nightstand with Nora.....and now it is wherever suits him that day! So, the pen came down after a month and I say they couldn't be happier.

Brodie now explores the rest of the condo on a regular basis; wandering all the way to the dining room. We now also have a litter box and water bowl set up next to the table in there for when he wants to venture out. Every once in a while, I'll be in the kitchen and Brodie will just come motoring' through like its no big deal, on his way to his little safe spot in the corner of the dining room. If he's feeling up to it, he'll do really fast laps around the dining room table and then chill out underneath it.

They both had a check-up at Oakhurst Veterinarian Hospital about a month and a half ago. We were a little concerned thinking Nora had a breathing problem, but it turned out not to be as bad as we thought. A week's worth of medicine cleared up the little sniffles for her. Brodie had what they thought might have been a minute case of soft poopy butt, but again, they were not at all alarmed by it. He also received a weeks worth of medication every day from us.

The week we spent medicating them deepen the bond between us. It helped them get use to us in a different way as well. They gained just a little more trust in us holding them and being that much in contact with them on a regular basis. A good month and a half has gone by or more since their meds and trip to the vet and they couldn't be in better shape. We also found out that a good friend we both trust works there, so Sandy and I felt more at ease with someone we knew taking care of them.

At the vet's suggestion, we have now switched to feeding fresh greens over pre-packaged greens.

We were buying a good variety, but it was hard to know if it was fresh every time. Even sometimes buying something with a week to go on it; it was bad. With their new diet now a part of their routine they don't leave a piece behind, and absolutely love the dandelion greens!

We truly enjoy waking up every day, taking care of, talking to and watching our little ones do their thing. They definitely knew what was best for them and if they had it any other way they would have kicked us out of the bedroom all together.... though when I hear them crash their plates at night after they've eaten I know its time for us to come to bed. They seem to settle down then; not being able to get a good night sleep with out us in the room.. And, I guess, the same goes for us :)

Kirby was afraid for 2 days before he settled down into his new home, a three story rabbit condo overlooking New York City complete with a play pen known as his "front yard". I've spent many hours on the floor of his play pen looking into his shy eyes wondering what he's seen and how he lived his life before entering mine. This little creature was full of insecurity. I decided in those silent moments that I would do anything to make him a happy bunny. My husband and I were all he had in this world now.

The first time he was ill, I stayed with him at night to pet him and make sure he didn't feel alone. The first time I left on vacation since he came, I couldn't stop thinking of him. When I returned home with jetlag he played with me all night. When the financial crisis began to strike the nation and my world seemed to turn upside down, Kirby was waiting for me to come home and everything was wonderful again.

Friends and family have come to meet him but all they see is a hesitant and withdrawn black rabbit. To his bunny mom and bunny dad, though, he is full of life. Well, she was very convincing and soon we were looking for a way to adopt another rescue bunny.

Luckily we found Karen and Wendy of Safe Haven, amazingly dedicated rabbit gurus, who quickly dashed our hopes of two rabbits just instinctively getting along, but more important explained to us how once rabbits did bond, there was nothing like the love they shared.



That's when we started realizing what bonding rabbits was all about. Karen and Wendy introduced us to Grayson (now Chewy, short for Chewbacca which is exactly who Chewy takes after). We brought Smudge to meet Chewy and they seemed to actually get along and we thought it may work. Roxanna was smitten and there was no turning back. But we knew we were in it for the long haul. Thankfully we were always able to call Karen and Wendy and they offered us great advice. Ten long days later, after following all the rules and giving the rabbits time to get to know each other, they fell in love. They still bicker every now and again, but by the end of the day they always end up snuggling together as happy as can be.
